CARTOONING IN THE DIGITAL AGE

Cartooning in the Digital Age is a cartooning workshop that will be held at the South Sioux City Public library on August 26th at 6:00 p.m.

Cartooning in the Digital Age is a two-hour program by veteran cartoonist Bill Barnes (Unshelved, Not Invented Here). The first part, The Basics of Cartooning, is a fast and fun workshop for middle schoolers through adult, covering every step in creating a comic strip: creating memorable characters, writing dialog, lettering, pencilling, inking, and coloring. The second part, The Technology and Business of Cartooning, is oriented towards mature teens and adults. Bill demonstrates how to use computers to create

and publish comic strips to the Internet, and how to make money doing it.

Bill Barnes loves librarians, show tunes, and meat. He can count his toes without taking off his shoes. Over the past eleven years, he has tried to convince Gene that the meaning of "partnership" is doing what he says 99% of the time. He can often be seen wandering the floor at trade shows playing "The Final Countdown" on his ukulele Death Adder. In his spare time he draws Unshelved and writes a comic about the software industry, Not Invented Follow @billba.







Harris has covered the religion beat for ABC News, as well as being an anchor and an on-air personality. He covered the rise and fall of Ted Haggard, among other religious stories during those days. Harris goes on to discuss his pilgrimage to Buddhism. The book has two distinct appeals. For the mews hound, it is a great inside look into the politics of news. For the person interested in religion, it covers a number of the movements of religion in pop culture. 10% Happier is not only a good book, it is a good philosophy of life. - OverDrive Audiobooks

"NPR Driveway Moments: Baseball Radio Stories That Won't Let You Go" performed by Neil Conan.

Driveway moments are those times when you have that song, or that story on your preferred listening device and you can't get out until it's over. NPR collected many baseball stories into an audio treat. During this recording hear stories about stealing baseball signs, the stadium organist who was thrown out of a game, the first World Series, Jackie Robinson Rookie of the Year, and so much more.
