## NANCY GILLIS TO SPEAK AT WRITER TO WRITER

Nancy Gillis will speak on writing book reviews at this month's Writer to writer meeting.

Nancy Gillis, of Cherokee/Muskogee/Choctaw heritage, is the retired CEO of the John Neihardt Foundation. Gillis joined the Foundation in May 1997 with experience in education and corporate administration. She regularly speaks to schools and civic groups on the work of John Neihardt, and has served on the faculty at Nebraska Indian Community College. First arriving to Nebraska in 1987 to work with the Winnebago Tribe for the Reformed Church in America, she served on that denomination's Native American Council and Commission

for Race and Ethnicity. She has also been the recipient of a fellowship from the Smithsonian Institution to take part in Diversity Leadership and Museums training in Washington, D.C. She currently serves on the board of the Nebraska Folk Life Network, and the Nebraska State Historic Preservation Society.

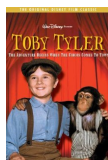

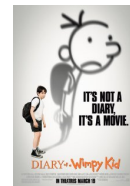

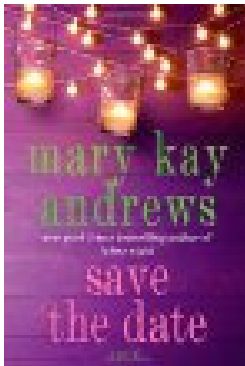
### Guidelines when Choosing Books for Babies

- Newborns are drawn to bold and starkly contrasting colors. They also enjoy geometric patterns, shiny surfaces, and noisy or "crackly" textures.
- Most infants have a tendency to put things in their mouths. So, it's a good idea to choose board books or cloth books.
- Keep in mind that you don't have to wait until birth to begin reading books to children. From the seventh month of fetal development, your baby can hear what's going on outside the womb, especially the sound of your voice. While reading to your unborn baby, you may notice she'll respond by kicking and moving, the first of many interactions with you. By the time she enters the world, she'll be primed for many more shared stories to help her reap the benefits of early literacy.

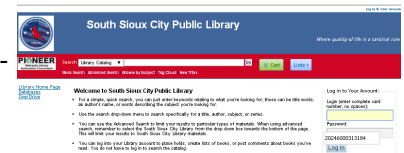

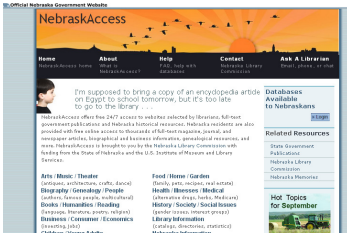

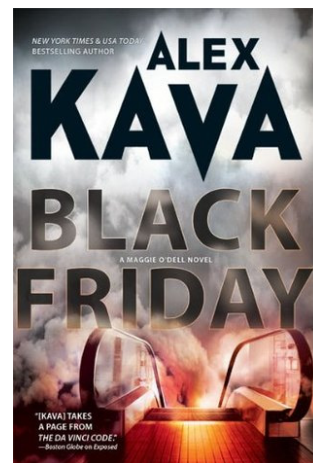

Rizzoli must break through the doubts of the her colleagues to pursue the Surgeon and his Apprentice. This series is the basis for the popular series *Rizzoli and Isles* on TNT.

*Black Friday: a Maggie O'Dell* by Alex Kava finds Maggie O'Dell called to the Mall of America in Minneapolis Minnesota, where backpack bombs were detonated on Black Friday. O'Dell's team works to find the mastermind of the plot before others

are killed.

*Back in the Saddle Again* by the Yampa Valley Boys. This one is from the vault.
