in high school during the day. I really enjoyed it but I still wanted to be a comic book artist! I went to college for art and ended up working in the library on campus part-time during the school year and fulltime

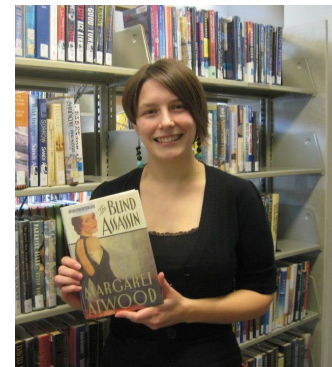
over the summers. I realized then that I really did enjoy working in a library. However,

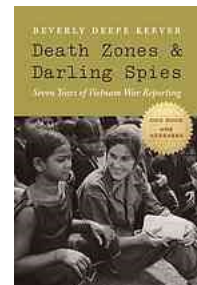

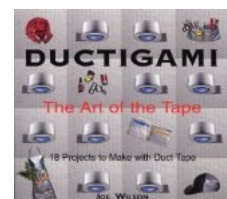

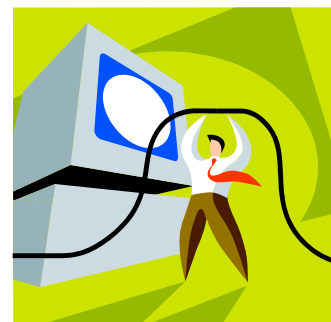

HOW TO GET A LIBRARY CARD

How to Obtain a Library Card:

To obtain a card a person must be:

At least 16 years of age. If younger, a parent/guardian must sign the application form.

Complete the application form.

Show two (2) forms of identification with current address. Such identification shall be a valid driver's license or other valid identification issued by a state or federal

government office; together with a bill or other official mail addressed to the person at the current address and postmarked within the last thirty (30) days..

After July 1, 2013, an annual fee of \$35.00 will be charged to all persons who do not meet the South Sioux City/Dakota County resident criteria.

New patrons may check out two materials at a time for the first six months.

Loan Periods for Materials: The following are the loan periods for specific types of materials. Exceptions are subject to the discretion of the Library staff members:

- Books 3 weeks
- Audiobooks/ Music CDs 2 weeks
- DVDs 5 Days



WHAT IS HERITAGEQUEST

The following article comes from the documentation of the HeritageQuest Online Database.

ProQuest Information and Learning's HeritageQuest Online provides libraries with a unique, growing collection of research materials for tracing family history and American culture. Beginning or professional genealogists can now use this powerful online library, with original page images for all documents, from the convenience of their home or at the library. Indexes and original

page images mean no additional trips, inter-library loan requests or work by researchers or staff.

HeritageQuest Online is designed specifically for patrons in public libraries who are either just beginning their family research or who after years of work are still uncovering their past. With over 28,000 books currently available, the entire U.S. Federal Census, PERSI™, Freedman's Bank Records, Revolutionary War Pension Records, and other expanding collections, HeritageQuest Online

gives any library the opportunity to tap into one of the largest collections of genealogy material in the country.

Ask About Our Local History Room. The library is in the midst of developing the Sides Local History Room. When it is finished it will house local histories of people and places in Dakota County.

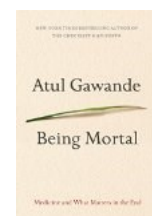

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

The Goldfinch by Donna Tartt. Theo Decker miraculously survives an accident that takes the life of his mother. Thus begins a rocky journey from New York to Las Vegas to the Netherlands in a quest for a lost work of art. Along the way he deals with his abandonment, loss, and a haunting search for wholeness in a broken world. The book is beautiful and enigmatic with characters you will not soon forget.

The Invention of Wings by Sue Monk Kidd. Coming of age would not do this beautiful novel justice. At age thirteen, Sarah Grimke, is given her first handmaiden, a rite of passage for young women in antebellum America. Hetty "Handful" Grimke is an eleven year-old slave who is given to Sarah Grimke. *The Invention of Wings*

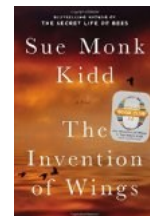
is follows both of these young women as they grow; Hetty in her desire to be a free woman and Sarah in her development of an abolitionist conscience. The book is loosely based on historical people and events.

The Racketeer by John Grisham. Jailhouse lawyer, Malcolm Banister, knows who killed a federal judge and his secretary and why. He parlays this into witness protection, freedom, and a maze of events that draws the reader into a story they cannot set aside. John Grisham takes the legal thriller in new directions, yet comes back to issues of corruption in the government.

Greatest Hits by Marshall Tucker Band. I remember Marshall Tucker Band as one of the leaders in southern rock movement of the 1970s, but on second

hearing, it is much more. Marshall Tucker Band is an eclectic combination of western, country, Texas swing, and jazz. The rich vocals of songs like *Fire on the Mountain*, *Heard it in a Love Song*, and *This Ol' Cowboy* are reminiscent of people like Michael Martin Murphy who can transport the reader to a camp fire under the open skies. The flute is prominent in so many of the cuts bringing a fresh sound that one does not expect in country or rock music.

Southern Surroundings: the Ultimate Skynyrd Collection by Lynyrd Skynyrd is three disc set that will take you back to the heart of southern fried rock of the 1970s. Greatest hits in audio CD, live DVD recording, and audio and video CD.
