## THE LIFE AND LEGEND OF ANNIE OAKLEY

The Life and Legacy of Annie Oakley will be presented by Charlotte Endorf on Monday March 7th at 6:30 p.m.

Annie Oakley was described as the "greatest woman rifle shot." A star attraction of Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show, Oakley thrilled audiences around the world with her daring shooting feats. A champion in a man's sport, she changed ideas about the abilities of women in the 19th century, yet she opposed female suffrage. Her fame and fortune came from her skill with guns, yet she was a Quaker. Endorf's presentation guides the audience through these dichotomies and dispels myth to reveal the real Annie

Oakley.

Charlotte Endorf is a lifelong Nebraskan, a member of Toastmasters International (earning the Distinguished Toastmaster award twice). She specializes in speaking to elementary schools, women's groups, museums, town festivals, senior centers, and libraries throughout Nebraska bringing the platform girls of the Can-teen, Annie Oakley and the Orphan Train accurately. Endorf and her daughter, Sarah, have published ten books. Endorf also developed three documentaries keeping history alive, and a CD with an actual Orphan Train rider after a trip to New York City to uncover her records dating back to

1917.

This program is made possible through grants from the Humanities Nebraska, the Nebraska Cultural Endowment, and the Carmen and John Gottschalk Foundation.

It is also a Women's History Month Program.

**Wizard of Oz** (2/29, 3/5) Dorothy Gale lives with her Aunt Em and Uncle Henry. She has a pet dog named Toto. When Miss Gulch takes Toto away, Toto escapes and runs back to Dorothy. Soon, she runs away from home, and runs into the fake psychic, Professor Marvel. He tells Dorothy that her Auntie Em is sick, so Dorothy and Toto run back home, but a

tornado comes and takes Dorothy and Toto to Oz, a place somewhere over the rainbow.

**The Sword and the Stone** (3/7, 3/12) King Arthur, under the instruction of Merlin the magician, is transformed into a fish, a squirrel, and a bird, and explains how he is returned to normal and named king.

Newborns are drawn to bold and starkly contrasting colors. They also enjoy geometric patterns, shiny surfaces, and noisy or "crackly" textures.

Most infants have a tendency to put things in their mouths. So, it's a good idea to choose board books or cloth books.

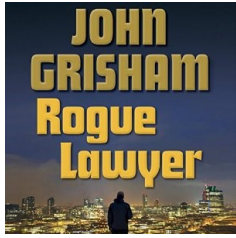
Keep in mind that you don't have to wait until birth to begin reading books to children. From the seventh month of fetal development, your baby can hear what's going on outside the womb, especially the sound of your voice. While reading to your

unborn baby, you may notice she'll respond by kicking and moving, the first of many interactions with you. By the time she enters the world, she'll be primed for many more shared stories to help her reap the benefits of early literacy.

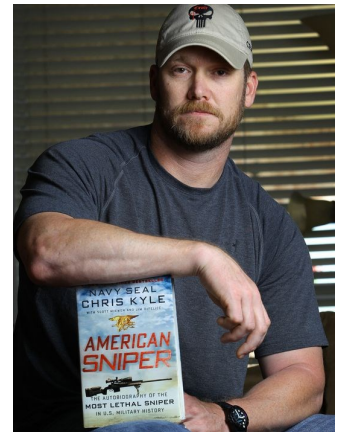

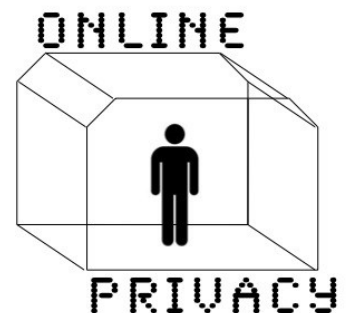

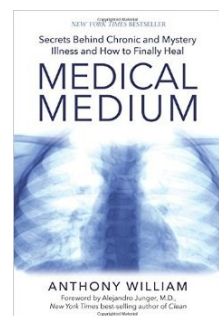

## STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

**Winter Morning Walks: One Hundred Postcards to Jim Harrison** by Ted Kooser. Since the first of the year everyone seems to be looking for ways to motivate themselves to walk more. Well, look no more. *Winter Morning Walks* is a celebration of the things the one sees and thinks about when walking. Kooser paints landscapes and still life portraits with an economy of words. The poems run from December to March, portraying the variety of sights and sounds one sees in rural Nebraska. Don't give up your exercise app, but add *Winter Morning Walks* for a little extra motivation.

**Man's Search for Meaning** by Viktor Frankel is the memoir of a Holocaust survivor, followed by his insights of the source of the many of the causes of men-

tal illness today. Frankel recommends that we ought not seek happiness, but rather seek meaning in suffering. This is one of the 100 Best Books of the 20th Century. It is well worth reading. This book is available on OverDrive and in the nonfiction section of the library.

**One Summer, America 1927** by Bill Bryson. Iowa Native, Bill Bryson tackles the summer of 1927, one of the pivotal years in the 20th century.

In this volume he tells the story of Charles Lindbergh and the Spirit of St. Louis in their transatlantic flight from the United States to Paris, France.

He gives a deep inside look into the life of Herbert Hoover, his rise to prominence as an aid worker, and his rise in Republi-

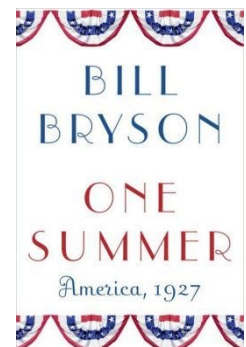
can Party.

He also takes on the presidency of Calvin Coolidge, who was known more for his trips to the American West than for political policies.

In this year, the New York Yankees put their mark permanently on professional baseball. He discusses the home run derby between Babe Ruth and teammate Lou Gehrig: a race that would permanently change the game of baseball from a game of slapping hits to the game of the long ball.

1927 was also the year of the introduction of the *Jazz Singer*, the first talking picture.

Bryson lends his humor and poetry to these topics and more in this lovely book.
