### STAFF BIOGRAPHY: GIZELA MORENO

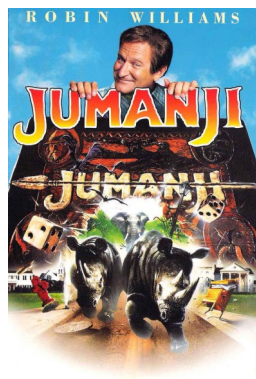

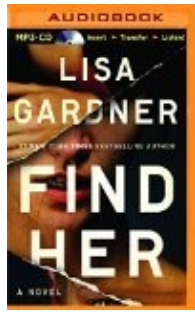

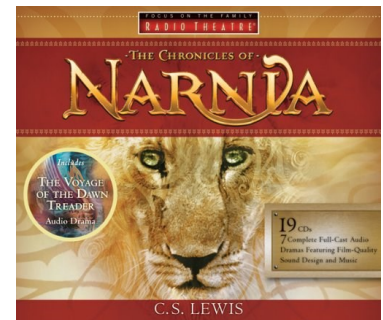

### **"Let's Take the Long Way Home: a Memoir of Friendship" by Gail Caldwell**

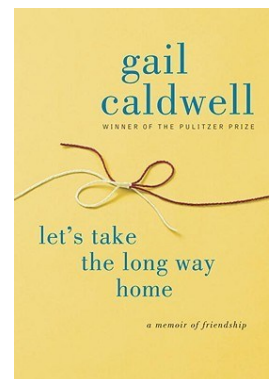
Gail Caldwell and Caroline Knapp were long time friends. Both were writers, Caroline the leading literary celebrity with her book *Drinking: a Love Story* propelling her to popularity. They also shared a love of drinking, which both had to overcome. They also had a great love of dogs. The book celebrates their levels of friendship, Caroline's battle with cancer and Gail's great grief at the loss of her friends. This is a great read for lovers of books, lovers of dogs, and everyone who has had a deep friendship and lost that friend.

**"Between the World and Me" by Ta-Nehisi Coates.** In this open letter to his son, Ta-Nehisi

Coates writes a story of the fear for their own bodies that African-American men face. He takes a blunt look at history that is well worth reading for everyone.

**We Don't Think You're a Racist! Soothing Affirmations from People of Color by Amanda Meadows & Robin Higgins.** Take a satirical look at many of our prejudices in the book, *We Don't Think You Are Racist!* Meadows and Higgins poke at many of our hidden (and not so hidden) prejudices. If you are like me, you will both laugh and squirm as you recognize yourself. Don't worry! This book is meant to be encouraging rather than discouraging.

**Animal Rescue by Patrick George** In this mostly wordless book, Patrick George reveals many ways in which animals are endangered by humans: zoos, circuses, and a number of other ways. Through the use of transparent pages, he shows that animals are bound and how they look when they are freed. This book demonstrates to young ones ways in which they could rescue animals and return them to the wild. It is a great book for parents and teens to share together.
