
access to information.

My Story Elizabeth Smart

Cover to Cover Book Club meets on the second and fourth Mondays of each month at 3:00 p.m.

On Monday July 11th we will discuss the second half of the book Beach Music by Pat Conroy. In this novel, Jack McCall is an American living in Rome with his young daughter, trying to find peace after his wife's suicide. He tells of the dark memories that haunt his family and friends, spanning Rome and South Carolina,

reaching back to the terrors of the Holocaust.

On Monday July 25th we will discuss the book My Story by Elizabeth Smart. The following is a description of the setting of this book. "On June 5, 2002, fourteen-year-old Elizabeth Smart, the daughter of a close-knit Mormon family, was taken from her home in the middle of the night by religious fanatic, Brian David Mitchell and his wife, Wanda Barzee. She was kept chained, dressed in dis-

guise, repeatedly raped, and told she and her family would be killed if she tried to escape. After her rescue on March 12, 2003, she rejoined her family and worked to pick up the pieces of her life. Now for the first time, in her memoir, MY STORY— from the Publisher

Reading to Babies

You wouldn't wait until your baby started forming words and sentences before talking to him or her – so why hold off introducing the joys of reading to your little one? Although most of the positive effects become evident as the child reaches toddler and preschool ages, many of the important influences are forged during infancy. By reading to your new baby regularly, you'll be helping to build a foundation for lifelong learning and develop-

While it may seem that a newborn or infant won't get much from books at first, development experts agree that the first year of a child's life is a highly influential time, during which he'll learn the basic sounds and concepts that wills serve as the building blocks for cognitive development.

There are numerous benefits from reading time:
Bonding: When you share a book with your baby, she'll enjoy hearing the comforting rhythm of your voice, feeling your heart, and smelling your familiar scent.
Over time, she'll come to associ-

ate books with close, intimate time with Mommy or Daddy Early Language Skills: It may be a while before your baby begins vocalizing words and phrases, but that doesn't mean early reading sessions aren't important. By hearing you read aloud, your little one is exposed to the vowels, consonants, and syllables that form his native language.

Cognitive Stimulation: A baby's developing brain can be likened to a blank canvas, ready to be painted and shaped by the millions of sensory experiences she'll be presented with during

the first year of life. The colors, textures, and sounds in books will help accelerate your baby's mental growth and awareness of her surroundings.

More Restful Sleep: Reading to babies can be a soothing, comforting activity but don't be surprised if it takes a few sessions before you and your little one get into a rhythm with the right books and the right routine. By incorporating calm, unhurried reading into your little one's nighttime routine, you'll be helping to set the stage for a restful night's sleep.

Writing for Nebraska 150: Dakota County:





The World's Strongest Librarian by Joshua Hanagarne The world's strongest librarian: a memoir of Tourette's, faith, strength, and the power of family is one of those books that touches me on many levels. It is the story of a librarian who is a weightlifter. It is a book about someone who is dealing with a debilitating illness, in this case, Tourette's Syndrome. It is a book about faith and the struggle for connection with faith in the face of evidence against that faith. I could say more, but these are some of the many ways that this book has had an effect on me.

In the memoir, Joshua Hanagarne tells his life story interspersed with library anecdotes and references to Dewey numbers related to the subjects covered in each chapter. The book details his journey growing up in a Mormon family, the onset of Tourette's Syndrome and the efforts to which he and his family went to deal with the issue. You learn the role that weightlifting had to play in his dealing with the disease. He covers the challenges to his becoming a husband and father, as well as the path that led him to become a librarian.

"90 Minutes in Heaven" by Don Piper Don Piper is a Baptist minister who was involved in a fatal crash. He was declared dead by the rescue personnel. When another minister stopped by the accident and asked to pray for the man in the car. This is the beginning of the nonfiction work 90 Minutes in Heaven. The book recounts Piper's experience in heaven, his

miraculous coming back to life and the hard work of his recovery from the injuries from the accident.

The Carol Burnett Show: Carol's Favorites (DVD) The Carol Burnett Show was a family staple in our home growing up in the 1970's. This is a collection of full length episodes as they would have been seen in living rooms across America. In one episode, in which the Jackson 5 were co-stars, the show catches a California earthquake during a live taping. You will love watching them act through the earthquake. This is some of the best improvisation you will see on television.



The Carol Burnett Show Carol's Favorites
