
tion. However, as I'm a kid at heart, I also still love reading comic books, playing video games and visiting the Disney parks at any and all opportunities.

Pat-A-Cake Pals – story time for children under 2 years old; singing, dancing, stories, sensory play each Thursday at 10 a.m.


Explore the Arts – join us to explore the art of music on Thursdays at 4:30 p.m.



The 2016 Hugo Awards have been announced. This is a list of the best novel winner and finalist

The Fifth Season by N.K. Jemisin (Orbit) is the winner for best novel. It is the first book of the Broken Earth series.

Uprooted by Naomi Novik (Del Rey) "Agnieszka loves her valley home, her quiet village, the forests and the bright shining river. But the corrupted Wood stands on the border, full of malevolent power, and its shadow lies over her life. Her people rely on the cold, driven wizard known only as

the Dragon to keep its powers at bay. But he demands a terrible price for his help: one young woman handed over to serve him for ten years, a fate almost as terrible as falling to the Wood." from back cover.

Ancillary Mercy by Ann Leckie (Orbit) For just a moment, things seem to be under control for the soldier known as Breg. Then a search of Atheok Station's slums turns up someone who shouldn't exist - someone who might be a refugee from a ship that's been hiding beyond the empire's reach for three thousand years. In the meantime a messenger from the

alien and mysterious Presger empire arrives, as does Breg's enemy, the divided and quite possibly insane Anaander Mianaai - ruler of an empire that's at war with itself. Anaander is heavily armed and extremely unhappy with Breq.

Seveneves: A Novel by Neal Stephenson (William Morrow) Five thousand years later after a catastrophic event rendered the Earth a ticking time bomb, the progeny of a handful of outer space explorers--seven distinct races now three billion strong--embark on yet another audacious journey: to return to Earth.


want to help support our troops and their families back home.

Sycamore Row by John Grisham In this novel, John Grisham goes back to the characters and community of A Time to Kill, when Seth Hubbard, who is dying of cancer takes his own life. Before taking his life he changes his will, taking an inheritance from his children and giving the vast majority of his wealth to his housekeeper Lettie Lang. The story revolves around a complicated contest between two wills, Seth Hubbard's children. Lettie Lang, her family, and the extended community around Lettie Lang all of whom want their piece of the Hubbard fortune.

Grisham is a master of writing peculiar and interesting characters who serve as lawyers, judges, and other people in the community. The novel will keep you guessing from the beginning until


the end of the story. The novel kept me totally engrossed. It is highly recommended.

Overflow by Bryan Andrew Wilson. I was combing through some of the popular recordings on the religious charts, when I came across Overflow by Bryan Andrew Wilson. This recording features three renditions of the title cut Overflow. The first is Wilson with a gospel chorus and beautiful instrumentation. The second with the gospel chorus and instrumentation alone. Foll owed by an instrumental recording of the song. In the only other cut of the album Bryan sings the R & B standard Stand by Me and nails his unique version of the song. This recording is available on Freegal Music .

Demonstrate by William Murphy is a live gospel experi-

ence. Murphy is a commanding worship leader drawing a willing crowd to experience God in this album. It is available to both stream and download from Freegal Music.

You Shall Live by Marvin Sapp. This is gospel music at its best. Marvin Sapp is able to bring together joyous songs of praise with works based on traditional hyms and add deep heartfelt worship that comes with a life that has had its share of joy and pain.
