AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into the _____day of _______, 2017 by and between THE CITY OF SOUTH SIOUX CITY, DAKOTA COUNTY, NEBRASKA, a municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as "City"), and SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 11 OF DAKOTA COUNTY, NEBRASKA, a political subdivision (hereinafter referred to as "School"), WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, two certified officers of the South Sioux City Police Department employed by the City have been designated as Liaison Officers with their primary duties in the various schools of the School district; and

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum is entered into on March 27, 2017 between the Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska, a public body corporate, for and on behalf of the College of Architecture at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, hereinafter referred to as "the University", and the City of South Sioux City, an entity, hereinafter referred to as "the Client".

The Work may be terminated for any reason by either party upon sixty (60) days' written notice. If both parties wish to terminate this Memorandum by mutual written agreement, it may be terminated on an alternate time interval acceptable to both parties. Upon termination, the University will be reimbursed for all pre-approved costs and non-cancelable commitments incurred in the performance of the Project through the effective date of the termination.

Termination of this Memorandum by either party for any reason shall not affect the rights and obligations of the parties accrued prior to the effective date of the termination of this Memorandum. Except as otherwise set forth in this Section 4, no termination of the Memorandum, however effectuated, shall release the parties from their rights and obligations under Sections 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13. Neither party shall be liable to the other for damages of any kind, including incidental or consequential, on account of any termination of this Memorandum in accordance with this Section 4.

5. Intellectual Property

The term "Intellectual Property" shall mean all patent, copyright, trademark, trade names, trade secret or other tangible intellectual property rights first conceived, reduced to practice, authored or otherwise created in the performance of the Work. All right, title and interest in and to any such Intellectual Property, together with the materials created during the Project, shall belong to the Client. Within forty-five (45) days following completion of the Project, the University shall execute all necessary paperwork to vest such right, title and interest in the name of the Client. Reports

The University shall furnish to the Client periodic updates summarizing the work being conducted on the Project.

Proprietary Data

Unless otherwise required by law, the University will exercise reasonable efforts to maintain in confidence proprietary information disclosed or submitted to the University by the Client or accessible by the University via the Client's computer systems, or other information which is designated in writing, including by email, as confidential information at the time of disclosure, generated by the University from such information or developed by the University hereunder (collectively, "Confidential Information"). All Confidential Information shall be immediately returned to the Client, or destroyed, upon the Client's request. No Confidential Information may be disclosed in any publication, including those "Publications" described in Section 6, without the Client's prior written consent, which it may withhold in its sole discretion. The Client also agrees to only provide Confidential Information necessary to the completion of the Project. If Confidential Information is accessible to the University through a connection to the Client's computer systems, the Client agrees to terminate access immediately once the Confidential Information is no longer needed by the University. Unless otherwise expressly provided in this Memorandum or the Statement of Work, all work product delivered by the University to the Client is Confidential Information, regardless of whether it is designated in writing as such. Confidential Information does not include information which at the time of receipt:

Advocacy Policy South Sioux City Public Library

(Approved the City Council of the City of South Sioux City

Purpose

This policy defines when, why, how, and who would engage in advocacy activities on behalf of the South Sioux City Library.

Policy

Advocacy is an ongoing activity which lays the foundation for specific awareness and understanding of the importance of the Library. This policy applies to the Library Advisory Board, the Library Director, or designee, and any other staff members who are authorized by the Library Director to advocate on behalf of the South Sioux City Public Library. This assures communication in one voice, in an informed manner, the unique benefits of the Library in the community. This will ensure communication be positive and consistent.

GUIDELINES Advocacy Role

The Library Advisory Board:

- Participates in advocacy planning.
- Ensures that advocacy remains a planned and sustainable ongoing process at the Library.
- Fulfills its advocacy responsibilities by identifying and responding to issues, concerns, and government policies that may directly or indirectly affect the Library.
- Encourages Board members, staff, volunteers, concerned individuals, and other community organizations to bring advocacy issues to the Board's attention.
- May communicate, cooperate, and coordinate with other libraries, organizations, agencies, and institutions in order to support the advocacy initiatives of the Library

Issue Response

After discussion of the advocacy issue(s), the Library Board:

- Shall advise the Library Director to convey its concerns, in person or in writing, to the appropriate person, organization, or government agency, and possibly to the media.
- May convey its decision to the general public and to the Library membership and customers.
- Shall advise government officials on the impact of proposed policies.
- May, at its discretion and by duly approved motion, undertake lobbying activities in support or opposition to these policies.

Library Spokesperson

Either the Library Director (or designee) will:

- Be the official spokesperson for the Library on advocacy issues, depending upon availability and the nature of the issue.
- Speak to the transformative impacts on the Library.

1. The City received one responsive bid on July 27, 2017 for the '2017 South Sioux City 2.5 MW Generators & Ancillary Equipment' project. The responsive bid for Group A was \$2,832,372.46 and Alternate No. 1 was \$88,188.00 with the bid tab included. The bid received was under the Engineer's opinion of probable cost. JEO has completed athorough review of the bids and recommends that the City accept the lowest responsive bid submitted by Ziegler Inc. (Ziegler) in the amount of \$2,832,372.46 for Group A. Ziegler submitted a per year maintenance cost with an assumed 1,800 hours of run time per year per engine and JEO recommends that the City accept the lowest responsive bid submitted by Ziegler in the amount of \$88,188.00 for Alternate No. 1 to extend the warranty to 10 years.

The quantity of antifreeze required for the project cannot be determined until the construction plan set has been finalized, thus there will need to be a change order issued to Ziegler for the final calculated amount. At this time, an estimated budgetary number is \$17,000 and will be finalized at a later date.
