THE OUTLAW TRAIL BOOK FESTIVAL

The Outlaw Trail Book Festival will be held at the Library. We have three author talks during the weekend. Bill Zahren will speak at the library on Friday, October 13th at 3:00 p.m. Bill Zahren is author of the Kingman & Reed series of crime novels that includes *Officer Involved* (October 2015), *Paper Trail* (September 2016), and *Avenging Angel* (June 2017). Bill Zahren is a fifth-generation Iowa born in Lake Park. He graduated from Morningside College in Sioux City, Iowa, and worked for the Le Mars (Iowa) Daily Sentinel, Sioux City (Iowa) Journal and Gateway, Inc., before moving to West Des Moines where he now lives with his wife, Rhonda.

da ad dog, Molly. Bill and Rhonda have two daughters, Haley and Jena. Bill works as a full-time freelance marketing writer when not drafting the latest adventures of Tom Kingman and Hillary Reed. Brad Kellogg, author and historian from Wakefield, Nebraska will do a presentation based on his book *The Aisles of the Forgotten Graveyard*. He will tell tales of murder, vigilante justice, and mystery on Saturday morning at 10:00 a.m.

Jeff Barnes will present *A Bad Man in a Better Place: Jesse James in Nebraska* on Saturday October 14th at 2:00 p.m. In this presentation, The notorious Jesse James typically isn't thought of in connection with Nebraska... but he was

here. Nebraska was where the outlaw could find family and friends. It was where he could plan robberies, make a recovery or an escape, and even sit for his most famous photograph. He wanted to buy a farm here and some even say he started a family here! Author Jeff Barnes shares what's known of the truth, the fiction, and the legend of Jesse James in Nebraska.

A fifth-generation Nebraskan, Jeff Barnes is a former newspaper reporter and editor, trustee with the Nebraska State Historical Society, past chairman of the Nebraska Hall of Fame Commission, and former marketing director for the Durham Museum. **Continued on page 2. 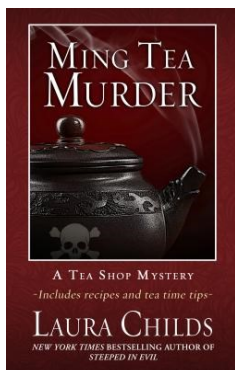

we will discuss the book *Wonder* by R.J. Palacio.

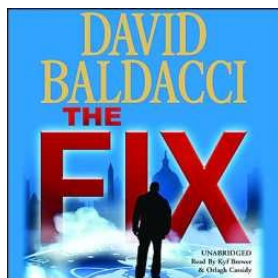

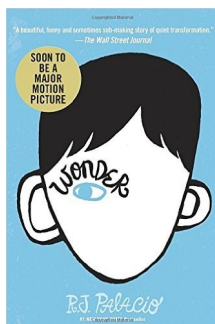
The Perfect Happiness by Santa

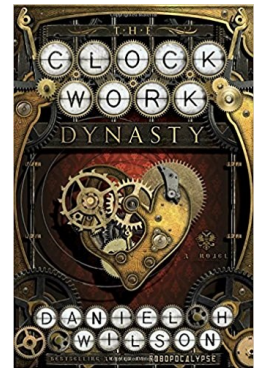

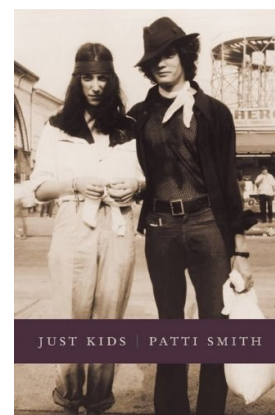
Just Kids by Patti Smith; I remember first hearing about Patti Smith in popular rock and punk rock magazines, the image of with her guitar on the pages of a magazine was all I knew of her until the fall of 1981 when I saw her on Saturday Night Live. She sang the song Gloria which I had heard other groups do. I couldn't hear or understand much, but it was a powerful performance. I never heard her again until a little later, when I heard her song Because the Night on FM radio. It was many years later when I heard of her work again, when I saw her book *Just Kids* in Booklist.

This book is a memoir of her long term relationship with the American artist Robert Mapplethorpe. The book traces Patti's story from her New Jersey

roots to her moving to her moving to New York to get away from the life of a factory worker. The bulk of the book tells the story of Mapplethorpe's struggle to make a name for himself in the art world. She is frank about the struggle they had as literal starving artists. The story is a who's-who of the underground art scene in the late 1960s and early 1970s. She also tells the story of her work as an artist, poet and later a musician. The descriptions of Mapplethorpe's art may be jolting to some, but it is a good read for anyone who is interested in rock music in the 1960s to the 1980s.

A Tale for the Time Being by Ruth Ozwka; *A Tale for the Time Being* by Ruth Ozeki is a dialogue between four authors, including Marcel Proust (1871-

1923). In Tokyo, sixteen-year-old Nao has decided there's only one escape from her aching loneliness and her classmates' bullying. While in western Canada, we meet Ruth, a novelist living on a remote island who discovers a collection of artifacts washed ashore in a Hello Kitty lunchbox—possibly debris from the devastating 2011 tsunami. In a series of alternating chapters, the reader is led to experience the pain of bullying, loneliness and frustration of writer's block and how the power of the written word can have over both the author and the reader. This book is excellent those who are interested in fiction set in Japan, those interested in environmental fiction, and those who like magical realism in fiction.
