



Coach Wooden and Me: our fifty year friendship on and off the Court by Kareem Abdul Jabbar (796.323 ABD); To make a long review short, this is one of the best books on sports that I have ever read. Having said that, let me tell you why.

John Wooden is one of the most successful coaches in college basketball. He was already a successful coach when Lew Alcindor joined the UCLA basketball player. He brought incredible height at seven feet two inches tall. He brought a successful career and an ego to fit his height,. That was until he met coach John Wooden.

These two men could not be more different. John Wooden was a conservative man of simple dress and Christian principles from his Midwestern heritage. Wooden was an optimist with a literary quote or a story to answer any question or point.

Lew Alcindor also known as Kareem Abdul Jabbar, was a young African-American who was already engaged in the Civil Rights Movement when he came to UCLA. Raised Roman Catholic, he was drawn to Islam as a way to understand his African American heritage.

Wooden was the Christian Midwesterner who's life tended to reflect the values of the 1950s

While they were extremely different they developed a lasting friendship that went far beyond college basketball to Jabbar's NBA career, and as an increasingly deep and close


friends through the 99 years of Wooden's life. This is an elegant that transcends basketball or sports in general.

Like I said at the beginning of the review, this is one of the best sports books I have ever read.
