Rupert Wates Live at the Red Bird Café, Rupert Wates will perform on Monday, June 18th at 7:00 p.m. Rupert Wates was born in London and studied at Oxford University. He has been a full time songwriter since the late 1990s, when he signed a publishing contract with Eaton Music Limited. His contract required him to write material in all kinds of styles and genres, for all kinds of artists. He worked extensively with Jazz vocalist Liz Fletcher, and wrote the album 'Blue Afternoons' (Mainstem, 2002) specially for her voice. Moving in 2001 to Paris, Wates formed his own quartet and began playing live regularly. In fall 2006 he came to the US. He is

now based in New York City and Colorado.

Since coming to the US, Wates has won more than 40 songwriting and performing awards (www.rupertwatesmusic.com/awards).

His music is an eclectic mix of acoustic, melodic art/folk, with flavors of jazz, vaudeville and cabaret. He has released nine solo CDs. They have been very well reviewed in the online press and tracks from them have been played on radio all over the world.

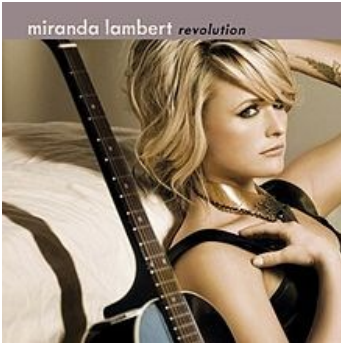
June 4th & 9th **Despicable Me 2** Recruited by the Anti-Villain League, Gru helps deal with a powerful new super criminal.

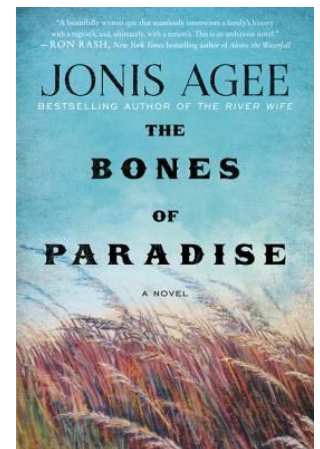
On June 25th, we will discuss *The Dry* by Jane Harper, a small town hides big secrets in an atmospheric, page-turning debut mystery.

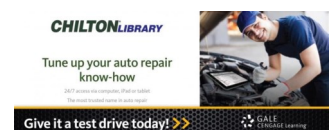

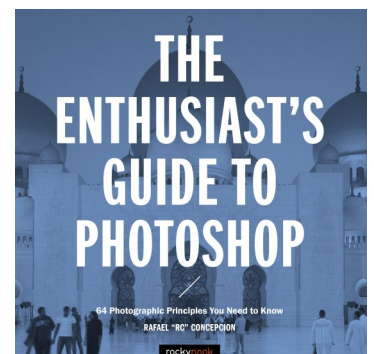

Bones of Paradise by Jonis Agee

Jonis Agee is a Nebraska treasure as she writes books about the scarred ground and bodies that make up the roots of Nebraska. This is definitely true in *Bones of Paradise*.

This book opens with murder and mystery in the sand hills. Ten years after the Seventh Cavalry massacred more than two hundred Lakota men, women, and children at Wounded Knee, J.B. Bennett, a white rancher, and Star, a young Native American woman, are murdered in a remote meadow on J.B.'s land.

Two strong women dominate the search for the truths that camouflage the truth of who killed J.B. and who killed

Star. Dulcinea fights to free herself from Drum Bennett, while she pushes the efforts to find J.B.'s killer. Rose seeks to avenge the death of her sister Star.

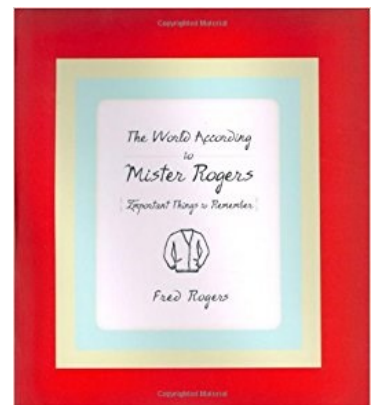
This book has the great surprises of a whodunit. It is a realistic western that paints a tale of 19th century dystopia. This book asks you to take some time to swim in the beautiful language, that describes dark places in America's past. This is highly recommended.
