STORYTELLING OF THE DAKOTA @ THE SOUTH SIOUX CITY PUBLIC LIBRARY

Joyzelle Gingway Godfrey will present *Storytelling of the Dakota* at the South Sioux City Public Library on Monday, November 5th at 6:30 p.m.

This presentation demonstrates the historic societal structure of the Dakota people through the medium of storytelling. The adventures of the first set of twins born in the world will give a glimpse of the family structure, food gathering and beliefs of their tribal people.

Joyzelle Godfrey is a retired college professor who taught Lakota Studies for Sinte Gleska University in South Dakota as well as English and Writing. Her storytelling is based on the historical culture of her Dakota people.

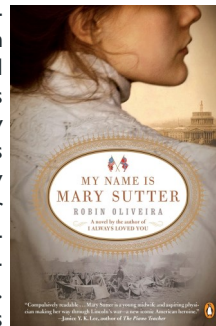
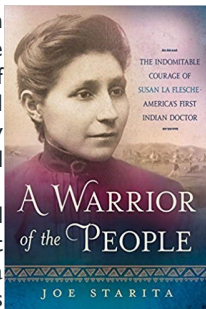
the lot of her people--physically, emotionally, politically, and spiritually."-- Provided by publisher.

for myself. I like being outside and going for walks or running. I also helped start the Tangled Yarns group at our library, where many of our patrons get to watch me attempt to crochet.

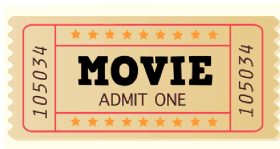
I love working in the library! I like seeing all the different people that come in and trying to help them with their questions or find a specific book for them. I also enjoy using my creativity to make

Moving Past Ramen: Join us for a time of learning the things that you should have learned in school. We meet on Saturday, November 17th at 3:00 p.m.

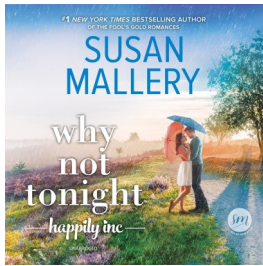

Superstars of the World Cup by Brendan Flynn (J 796.334 FLY). Brendan Flynn writes a brief easy to read story of some of the World Cup superstars. Lionel Messi is a member of the Argentina team, where he is a strong goal scorer and instrumental to Argentina's success. The book then tells the story of Cardi Lloyd, Midfielder of the United States Women's team. In 2015 she scored 3 goals in the first 16 minutes of a World Cup game against Japan. The story goes back to Cristiano Ronaldo of Portugal, who was also a powerful scorer. Finally, the book focuses on it's fourth star Marti of Brazil's World Cup team.

This book has some fun little Easter eggs in the form of a QR code on each player with extra

information about that player. They put the stars in a historical timeline from the beginning of the World Cup to each player's appearances in World Cup play. The book also contains a glossary and questions to consider for future work.

A.J. Styles: the phenomenal one by Teddy Borth (JBIO STY). This volume of the Wrestling Biographies, from Abdo Zoom, is full of information on the Phenomenal A.J. Styles. The book goes through Styles's beginnings in North Carolina, his rise on the independent wrestling circuit, his experience in TNA Wrestling, New Japan Pro Wrestling, leading up to his reappearance in the WWE Wrestling. This is a just the facts type of book, that will be popular among reluctant readers. It will also be popular

among male adults who are wrestling fans, as well as those who need to hone their reading skills.

When Monkeys Won't Go to Bed by Susanna Leonard Hill (BRD HIL). Susan Leonard Hill writes a fun little board book that we can share with the children in our lives. Parents and caregivers will recognize the number of tasks that one goes through to get a child to bed. Your little ones will not realize that we are telling a story about them. Parents and children will enjoy this book.
