Keep Grass out of our Streets:

There are several best management practices recommended for homeowners to help keep grass from clogging storm drains and preventing other environmental issues:

When mowing, direct grass clippings away from streets, driveways, sidewalks and other paved areas. Leave grass clippings on the lawn. (Grass clippings are composed of nearly 85% water)

Lawns mowed at taller heights are more competitive against weeds, and tend to withstand heat stress better. By leaving grass clippings on the lawn, you can reduce fertilizer 30 to 40%. (Leaving clippings in place leaves the equivalent of one pound of nitrogen per 1,000 sq. ft., the same amount you would get from one fertilizer application.)

If you must remove your clippings, compost them with leaves and soil. By following these simple suggestions, you are not only saving yourself money and helping the environment; you are becoming a little greener in the process.

STORMWATER FUN FACTS FOR KIDS



- The only water we will ever have is what we have now.
- In a 100-year period, a water molecule spends 98 years in the ocean, 20 months as ice, about 2 weeks in lakes and rivers, and less than a week in the atmosphere.
- Each day the sun evaporates 1,000,000,000,000 (a trillion) tons of water.
- Water is the only substance on earth naturally found in the three rule element forms: solid, liquid and gas.
- 80% of the earth's surface is water.
- 97% of the earth's water is in the oceans and seas.
- 66% of your body is water.
- Bones are 25% water.
- Human blood is 83% water.
- A person can survive without food for more than 30 days, but less than a week without water.
- A gallon of water weighs 8.34 pounds.
- For every 2.31 feet that water is raised above the earth's surface it can create one pound per square inch of pressure.
- For every 2.31 feet you are submerged below a body of water's surface there is 1 pound per square inch of pressure equally placed on your body.
- The first water pipes made in the U. S. were fire-charred, bored-out logs.
- There are over 1 million miles of water pipelines and aqueducts in the United States and Canada. That's enough to circle the globe 40 times.
- There are over 59,000 community public water systems in the U. S.
- The average household uses 107,000 gallons of water per year.
- It takes 1,851 gallons of water to refine one barrel of crude oil.
- It takes 120 gallons of water to produce one egg.
- Over 42,000 gallons of water (enough to fill a 30x50 foot swimming pool) are needed to grow and prepare food for a typical Thanksgiving dinner for eight.
- A single birch tree will give off 70 gallons of water per day in evaporation.
- An acre of corn will give off 4,000 gallons of water per day in evaporation

<u>Dakota County Star Podcast: Economic Development</u> <u>Director Oscar Gomez</u>

Economic Development Director Oscar Gomez Shares Vision for South Sioux City's Growth South Sioux City Economic Development Director Oscar Gomez recently joined the *Dakota County Star Podcast* to share updates on exciting developments shaping the future of the community. From the City's Inland Port Authority designation to plans for the upcoming casino and infrastructure improvements, Gomez provided insight into how South Sioux City is preparing for smart, sustainable growth.

During the interview, Gomez discussed:

Port Authority designation: South Sioux City was named Nebraska's fifth Inland Port Authority, unlocking over 1,600 acres for industrial, commercial, and entertainment development.

- Casino and entertainment district planning: With a new race-track opening this fall and a casino slated to break ground in 2026, the City is working to attract restaurants, hotels, and other attractions that keep visitors—and their spending—local.
 - Infrastructure improvements: The City is exploring potential roundabouts at 9th & Dakota Avenue and 39th & G Street to help manage traffic flow near schools, Tyson Foods, and new residential areas.
 - **Regional collaboration**: The Port Authority area spans South Sioux City, Dakota City, and Dakota County, creating a shared opportunity to support housing, employment, and quality of life for the entire region.

"It's a blank canvas," Gomez said. "We have the opportunity to do this right—with a vision that reflects what our community wants to become."

Sharing the Road Safely with School Buses.

- Never pass a bus from behind if it is stopped to load or unload children.
- If the yellow or red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended, traffic must stop.
- The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children; stop far enough to allow them space to safely enter and exit.
- Be alert; children are often unpredicable, and tend to ignore hazards and take risks.
