

It's City Fall Cleanup time! South Sioux City Fall Cleanup week is October 6th-10th 2025!

Tree debris pickup will be Oct. 13th-17th 2025!

Please wait to set out tree debris until this week.



NO *glass, paint, liquids, tires or trash amount over 1 pick-up load* will be allowed. Notice will be given to customers for the items listed or with more than a pickup truck load. It will then be the resident's responsibility to remove remaining garbage or tree debris. Garbage clean up is only in the fall.

Tree debris included for pick up must be less than 4' long, not over 4" in diameter and can only be tied together with string or twine. NO rope or wire! No more than 1 pick-up load allowed. Residents will be given notice if over 1 pick-up load etc. it will be their responsibility to remove remaining debris. Tree pick up is *only* in the fall.

Crews only make one pass for the clean-up each week, if items are set out after that pass it is the resident's responsibility to remove.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 14-14 AND 14-16 UNDER CHAPTER 14 PERTAINING TO ANIMALS; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING A TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH SIOUX CITY, NEBRASKA:

SECTION 1. <u>SECTION AMENDED</u>. Section 14-14 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Sioux City, Nebraska, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 14-14. – Restrictions on keeping certain animals – Permit required.

No person in any zone other than (AGT), Agricultural Transitional District shall have in his possession or control, or keep or harbor any equine or bovine animals, any sheep, goats, dogs in kennels for commercial purposes, pigs, mink or any live hares, rabbits, guinea pigs, **chickens**, turkeys, geese, ducks, doves, pigeons, game birds or other fowl without first having obtained a permit from the City Council, which permit shall be issued only after inspection of the premises and approval of the sanitary conditions of the premises by the animal control unit or its designee.

(Code 1975, § 6-140; Ord. No. 2002-3, § 1, 3-11-02)

SECTION 2. <u>SECTION AMENDED</u>. Section 14-16 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Sioux City, Nebraska, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 14-16. - Same-Appeal of denial or revocation of permit.

A person may appeal the denial of a permit required by Section 14-14 to the District Court of Dakota County, Nebraska.

(Code 1975, § 6-142)

SECTION 3. <u>REPEALER</u>. The remainder of Chapter 14 shall remain the same. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. <u>SEVERABILITY CLAUSE</u>. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof, not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect



Stop blocking the sidewalk


Pedestrian Traffic: Sidewalks are a safe place for people to walk along roadways without having to worry about getting hit by a

September 25th National Day of Remembrance for Murder Victims

Across the United States, September 25th is recognized as the National Day of Remembrance for Murder Victims. This day is meant to honor the memories of those victims, while also celebrating their life. The symbolism of September 25th is to show although cuts may heal, scars are left as a reminder. The lives of families who have lost a loved one are

affected day in and day out. These families are impacted greatly, as well as the entire community. It goes to show that these families are not alone. They not only have the support of a community, but the support of an entire nation.

There are some typical responses from families and friends of murder victims. Such responses can include shock or numbness, as if they are "watching a movie" and what they are experiencing is unreal. Denial is often felt by the

families and friends of the victim, which is used as an unconscious defense against the painful or unbearable memory. Intense anger is also another common emotional response which usually comes with the desire to "get even" with the person who committed the crime. More times than not, there is a sense of confusion about what happened and what is

going on around them. Lastly, feelings of guilt are very common. Due to families and friends feeling as if they could have done something to prevent their loved one's death.

Remember you are not alone. Many families and friends have lost loved ones to crimes of homicide or murder. It may be difficult to reach out for help, often you feel alone and isolated. There are advocacy services that will help you

during the coping process. Also, will help you become/stay active through the criminal justice proceedings. Advocates offer victims information about different options available to them and their rights of victims, survivors, and witnesses. Some advocates are survivors, themselves, or are family members who have lost a loved one and want to help.
