

### Clean up, Spruce up South Sioux City Fall Cleanup

It's City Fall Cleanup time! South Sioux City Fall Cleanup week is October 3rd-7th, 2022!

Tree debris pickup will be Oct. 10th-14th, 2022. Please wait to set

out tree debris until this week.



**NO** glass, paint, liquids, tires or trash amount over 1 pick-up load will be allowed. Notice will be given to customers for the items listed or with more than a pickup truck load. It will then be the resident's responsibility to remove remaining garbage or tree debris. Garbage clean up is only in the fall.

Tree debris included for pick up must be *less than* 4' long, not over 4" in diameter and can *only* be tied together with string or twine. NO rope or wire! No more than 1 pick-up load allowed. Residents will be given notice if over 1 pick-up load etc. it will be their responsibility to remove remaining debris. Tree pick up is *only* in the

Crews only make one pass for the clean-up each week, if items are set out after that pass it is the resident's responsibility to remove.

### FALL STORMWATER TIPS

Sweep up grass clippings and fertilizer from driveways, sidewalks and streets, and rake, mulch or compost yard waste. Fall is the best season to fertilize your lawn and control common weeds. Weed and feed responsibly. Use fertilizers and pesticides only as needed and always read and follow product instructions carefully. During routine fall tune-ups, check your car and lawn equipment for leaks. A good rainstorm can send gasoline and oil drips from automobiles, lawnmowers and power equipment into waterways. In urban areas, stormwater carries pollutants directly into the water ways through the storm drainage system. Unlike our household wastewater, stormwater doesn't go through a treatment plant first, but is dumped directly into lakes, rivers and wetlands.

### River Birch Tree



These trees prefer full sun but will tolerate partial shade. They tend to grow between 40 and 70 feet (12-21 m.) in height. Growing River Birch Trees in the Landscape In nature, you will most likely find a river birch tree growing near water. Because of its affinity for wet, heavy soil, planting a river birch tree can fill in spaces where nothing else seems to grow. If you have water on your property, consider lining it with river birch trees. If you don't, planting a river birch tree or two in your yard will make for an attractive specimen and shade tree. Surround the tree with heavy mulch to help keep the roots wet and cool. River birch trees can be grown direct from seed or planted as saplings. When seeds or saplings are starting out, it's important to control weed competition nearby either with weed fabric or select herbicidal spraying.
