For a number of years, the South Sioux City Chamberettes have been selecting Yard of the Month for ten different areas in South Sioux City for the months of June, July, and August. This is in keeping with their original mission of "Keeping South Sioux City Beautiful." Since it is approaching that time of the year, the Chamberettes would like to share some information with regard to this selection.

First of all, yards should be neat, well-manicured and free of weeds. The members look for "something extra" such as landscaping and flowers, well-kept shrubbery or an attractive front porch in making their final decision.

Records are kept of each year's selection and members try to spread the award around as much as possible by not selecting someone who has received it in the past two to three years. Many members like to go at least five years in order to award as many deserving yards as possible. So if you see someone whom you think is deserving and they haven't received it, perhaps it's because they have received it recently or perhaps they declined the award. Chamberettes members

NOTICE PROPERTY OWNERS AND OCCUPANTS OF SOUTH SIOUX CITY

8" Weeds, Grasses or Worthless Vegetation Removal and Litter Nuisance Ordinance No. 2013-17

City ordinance 2013-17 states in part "The owner or occupant of any lot or piece of ground shall keep the lot or piece of ground and the adjoining street and alleys free of any growth of eight (8") inches or more in height of weeds, grasses or worthless vegetation or to litter or cause litter to be deposited or remain thereon". In the event a property owner or occupant fails to abate the nuisance, the City shall have such work done and all costs associated with the nuisance abatement shall be the responsibility of the property owner. In addition to the costs associated with the nuisance abatement, fines shall be levied as follows:

1st Violation - \$100.00 2nd Violation - \$200.00 3rd Violation - \$500.00

GARAGE SALES

The City of South Sioux City recognizes the importance of garage sale to give the citizen a chance to reuse their family materials. The regulations are to allow that but control the frequency due the past complaints from neighbors.

No person shall operate, conduct, manage or permit a garage sale upon his, her or its premises or other property under his, her or its control more often than two (2) times per calendar year and said sale shall not be continued for a period of more than three (3) consecutive days. No sale shall be conducted before 8:00 a.m. or after 8:00 p.m. Outdoor garage sales are permitted only in areas zoned for residential use (R-Zones) Indoor only garage sales may be conducted in areas zoned for commercial use (C-Zones) or manufacturing use (M-Zones). You must receive a garage sale permit in advance at City Hall during regular office hours, Monday-Friday, 9am-5pm. There is no fee for the permit.

The licensee is allowed to post three off premise signs advertising the garage sale and the signs must be removed by the licensee by 5:00 p.m. on the last day of the sale. No sign shall be attached to any utility pole, light pole, tree or any other public facility located within the public right-of-way.

National Missing Children's Day

Each year, the Department of Justice (DOJ) commemorates Missing Children's Day with a ceremony honoring the heroic efforts of agencies, organizations, and individuals to protect children. In 1983, President Ronald Reagan proclaimed May 25 as National Missing Children's Day. This day is dedicated to encourage people that grow concern on the well-being of children to make child safety a priority. This also serves as a reminder to continue our efforts to reunite missing children with their families.

The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMRC) leads the fight against abduction, abuse, and exploitation. This program provides safety and prevention resources for families and child-serving professionals focusing on topics of real-world safety. This includes- skills on how to handle a variety of situations ranging from staying home alone to knowing what to do in case of an emergency, to abduction and child sexual exploitation prevention.
